2011 Chesapeake Chamber Music Festival's Final Weekend Performances  
Expand with a New Musical Venue

The Chesapeake Chamber Music Festival will close out its 2011 Festival with three rousing performances, including an afternoon concert in a new musical venue in St. Michaels, giving visiting boaters a chance to walk to the concert.

The weekend festivities begin with an ["Evening in Vienna" Concert](#) at the [Avalon Theatre](#) in [Easton](#) on [Friday, June 17](#) at [8 p.m.](#), featuring the works by Mozart, Strauss, and Schubert. On [Saturday, June 18](#) at [3 p.m.](#), the Festival will use the St. Michaels High School Auditorium as one of its new concert venues featuring music by Mozart, Torke, and Mendelssohn. The Festival hopes to attract residents and boaters vacationing in St. Michaels that weekend to take a walk through town to hear the concert. Students will be admitted free to this concert.

Don Buxton, executive director of Chesapeake Chamber Music, comments, “The sound clouds in the St. Michaels High School auditorium’s raised ceiling provide amazing acoustics, while the space itself has an intimate feel. It will be a perfect new venue for the Chesapeake Chamber Music Festival.”

The Festival will conclude with its Angels Concert, featuring works by Mozart, Gabrielli, Widor, Jolivet and Dohnányi on [Sunday, June 19](#) at [4 p.m.](#) at "[Elizabeth Point](#)" in [Oxford](#).
